Mercer residents question Aging Unit board

Claim two members have served past term limits

HURLEY — Iron County's Aging Unit board heard from two Mercer residents at its Thursday morning meeting at the senior center.

Victor Ouimette claimed two board members are serving in violation of a Wisconsin statute, past their six-year term limits, which calls everything the board does into question. "There is no right way to do a wrong thing," Ouimette said.

Eileen Gottwald and Jeanne Vandevorde have served for more than the six years, he claimed.

"The board needs new people and new ideas," he said.

Ouimette reviewed more than 1,500 pages of the aging unit's records, dating to 2007, as he requested them earlier this year. He also recommended developing a policy manual and revising agency bylaws.

John Sendra said his main interest is obtaining parity for the southern part of the county. He received a response to some of his questions by email from Pam Van Kempen of the Greater Wisconsin Agency on Aging Resources, and said that he will follow up with her.

In other business, the board approved a 2014 GWAAR budget of \$110,185.

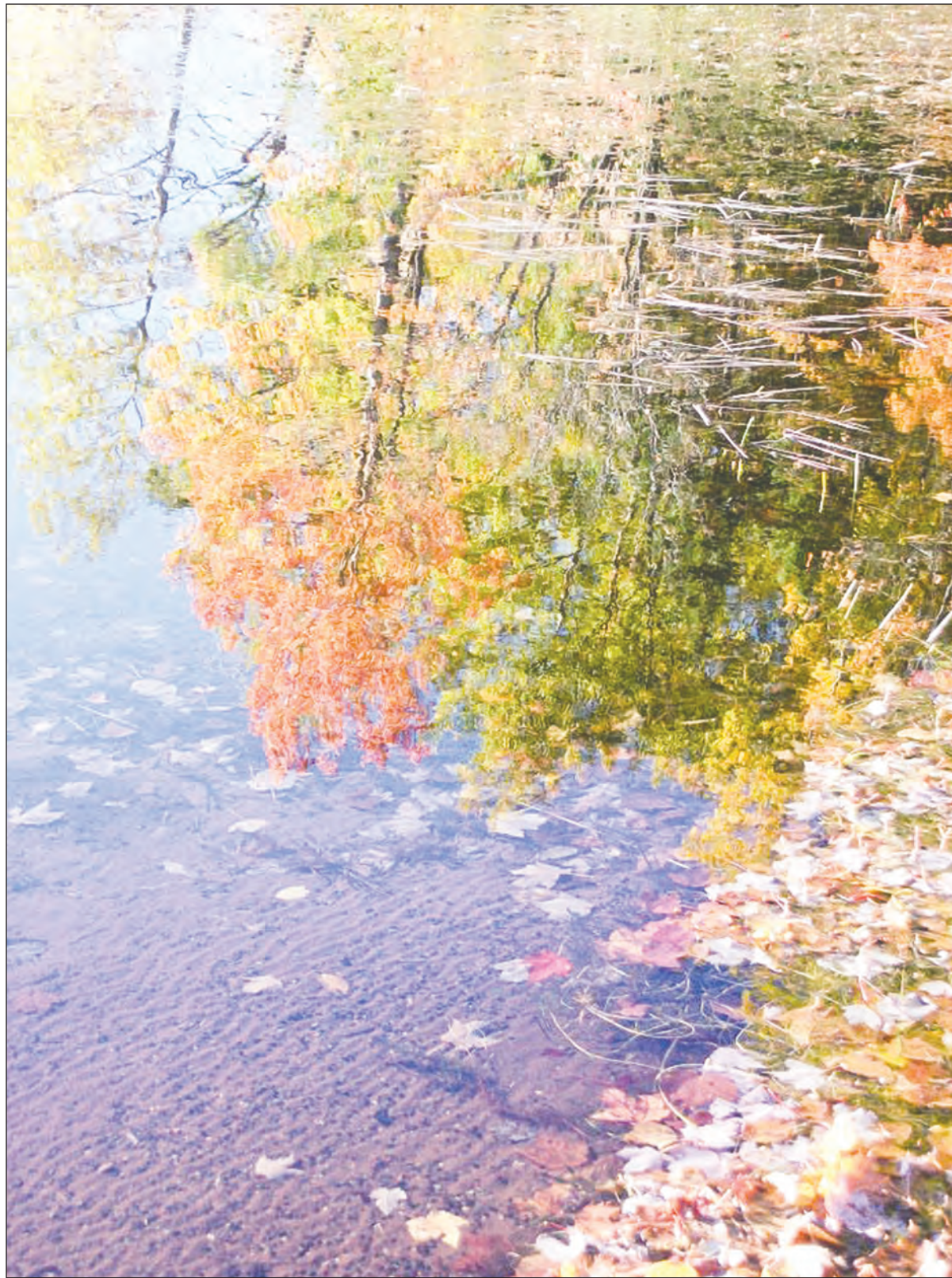
Aging director Mary Kay Welch spoke with the United Way Tuesday about possible donations for needed roof repairs. The agency currently has \$3,100 toward repairs, but will conduct fund-raising efforts and search for grant funding to meet the full cost, which is not determined.

The agency will advertise for an Experience Works worker for the Mercer site. To qualify for the 21-hour per week position, applicants must be over 55, income qualified, and residents of Wisconsin.

Welch said the agency served 3,079 meals in September, bringing the year's total to 19,245. The number of meals served at the Iron County Jail is going down since they do not house inmates from other counties anymore, Welch said.

Welch is investigating a possible cost-savings measure offered through Meals on Wheels Association of America's group purchasing program, which could save the agency at least \$5,000 per year.

Kill light for first few days of Wisconsin's wolf season

Although Wisconsin's second modern day wolf hunt is only a few days old, some interesting harvest results are being recorded.

According to the Department of Natural Resources, only eight wolves had been killed as of Thursday.

The planned hunting-trapping harvest is 251, although it's unlikely the kill quotas in all six of the state's wolf zones will be reached.

Not surprisingly, four of the wolves were taken from Zone 2,

which includes part of eastern Iron County and Vilas County. The Zone 2 quota has been set at 28 wolves, while Zone 1, which includes most of Iron and Ashland counties, has a 76-wolf goal. No wolves had been reported killed to the DNR in Zone 1 as of Thursday.

What is surprising is that two wolves were taken in Zone 6, which is in roughly the bottom one-fourth of the state. The quota there is 30, showing that the DNR realizes the animals have expanded into the far southern part of the state.

Wisconsin permits both hunt-

ing and trapping of wolves, while Michigan's upcoming season will allow only hunting.

In 2012, wolf hunting and trapping thinned the Wisconsin pack by 119 animals. Another 76 wolves were killed by human control methods because of predation, according to the DNR, and 24 were killed by vehicles, 21 were killed illegally and five deaths were from undetermined causes. Total mortality was 243 wolves.

The season runs through Feb. 28. Licenses cost \$49 for residents and \$251 for non-residents.

Wording for McDonald recall petition approved

BESSEMER — The Gogebic County Election Commission Thursday approved language for a ballot on whether Bill McDonald should be recalled from the Bessemer School Board.

Sheri Graham, a fellow school member who is attempting to oust McDonald from office, will now have 180 days to collect signatures for a recall petition. The earliest a recall election could be held

would be next May.

In her second effort to approve language for the ballot, Graham alleged:

—McDonald misled voters, telling them to vote no on a bond issue and to vote for plan B, when there was no plan B.

—Disregarded the school district's bidding process by giving out premature information to a contractor without the board's knowledge.

—Used foul language at board meetings, even though being warned not to do so by board presidents.

All three allegations were included in Graham's first effort to get recall language

Hurley American Legion ends lease with Memorial Building

HURLEY — The Hurley American Legion voted to terminate its lease with Iron County for the Iron County Memorial Building Wednesday evening.

According to Legion member Bob Traczyk, most members were in favor of terminating the lease and voted as such. The Legion pays \$1 per year to the county for the building, but with a decline in bowling, the Legion has had trouble making enough revenue to pay utility bills.

During a meeting of the Iron County Finance Committee Wednesday morning, Traczyk and other Legion members addressed the committee about the lease and a

proposal to have the Iron County Memorial Building Restoration Committee take over the lease was brought up.

The restoration committee has spent nearly \$54,500 over the past four years on the building, and many finance committee members didn't want to see it close.

Despite the Legion breaking the lease, the building will remain available to rent for special occasions, such as weddings.

According to Traczyk, a member of the restoration committee, it will take over the lease, if financially possible.

Michigan delegation split on vote to end shutdown

CRYSTAL FALLS (AP) — Four of Michigan's nine Republican U.S. House members and all five of its Democratic representatives voted in favor of legislation to avoid a federal debt default and end the 16-day government shutdown.

Michigan Democratic U.S. Sens. Carl Levin and Debbie Stabenow both voted yes as the Senate approved the measure,

81-18.

Rep. Dan Benishek, R-Crystal Falls, said he voted for the bipartisan compromise Wednesday night to "reopen the government and prevent the country from defaulting."

"Northern Michigan families deserve a government that's open and running," said Benishek, a first-term House mem-

ber representing the Upper Peninsula and a large stretch of northern lower Michigan. "They also deserve to have their finances secure and not be put at risk by a government default."

The House passed the proposal 285-144, with all 198 Democrats and 87 of 231 Republicans voting yes.

"I'm deeply concerned that a default

could lead to higher interest rates and even a larger national debt," Benishek said in a statement. We can't let that happen. Moms and dads up here in Michigan shouldn't be hurt just because Washington can't get its act together."

Other Michigan Republicans who voted yes were Dave Camp of Midland, Mike Rogers of Howell and Fred Upton

of St. Joseph. No votes came from Republicans Justin Amash of Cascade Township, Kerry Bentivolio of Milford, Bill Huizenga of Holland, Candice Miller of Harrison Township and Tim Walberg of Tipton.

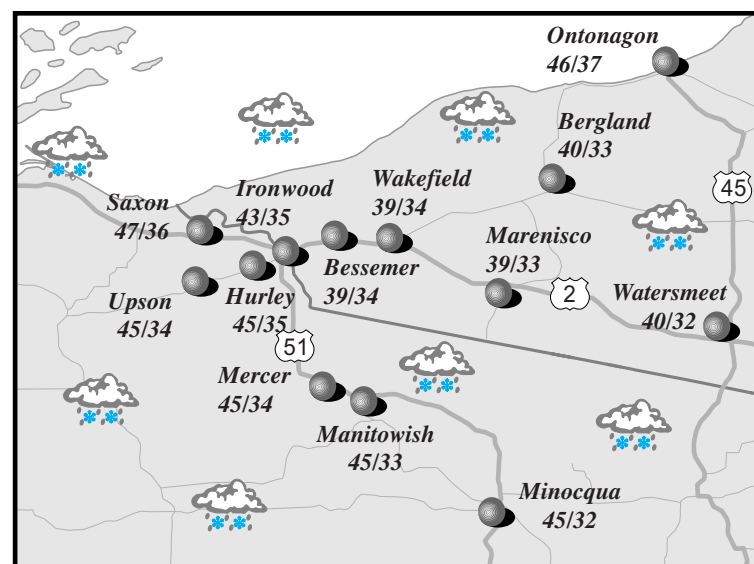

Parks open, workers back in office after shutdown

(AP) — From the Liberty Bell to Alcatraz, federal landmarks and offices reopened Thursday. Furloughed employees were relieved to get back to work — even if faced with email backlogs — but many worried about another such disruption in a matter of months.

“We’d hate to have to live through this all over again,” Richard Marcus, a 29-year employee of the National Archives in Washington, said after the government shutdown finally ended.

Nationwide, from big-city office buildings to wilderness outposts, innumerable federal services and operations shifted back into gear after 16 days.

The U.S. Forest Service started lifting a logging ban on national forests. U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services restarted the computerized system used to verify the legal status of workers. Boat trips resumed to Alcatraz, the former federal prison in San Francisco Bay, with 1,600 tickets snapped up by tourists in the first hour of business.

In Alaska, federal officials rushed to get the red king crab fishing season underway. The opening had been delayed because furloughed workers were not around to issue crab-quota permits.

National Park Service Director Jonathan Jarvis said all 401 national park units — from the Golden Gate National Recreation Area in California to Acadia National Park in Maine — were reopening Thursday.

More than 20,000 National Park Service employees had been among the 800,000 federal workers sent home at the peak of the shutdown.

At Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks, employees were busy with reopening chores. They returned just in time to begin closing the parks up again for the winter in a couple of weeks.

At Philadelphia’s Independence National Historical Park, one couple’s long wait to see the Liberty Bell and other attractions finally drew to a close.

Karen and Richard Dodds of Oklahoma City were on a quest to see every national park in the U.S. They arrived in Philadelphia about three weeks ago in their motor home, visiting Valley Forge just before the shutdown. They stayed on in the area, awaiting a settlement.

“They didn’t solve anything by this,” Katie Dodds said of the temporary agreement in Congress that funds the government only through Jan. 15 and gives it the borrowing authority it needs only through Feb. 7. “The worst part is they’ll do it again in January and February.”

Among the many sites reopening in Washington were the Smithsonian Institution’s museums and the World War II memorial on the National Mall, which had been the scene of protests over the shutdown.

Smithsonian spokeswoman Linda St. Thomas said the museum complex lost about \$2.8 million in revenue during the shutdown.

The National Zoo was set to reopen Friday, though its popular panda cam went live Thursday morning, giving fans a view of a cub wriggling about as its mother, Mei Xiang, tucked her paws under her chin and watched.

Federal workers who were furloughed or worked without pay during the shutdown will get back pay in their next paychecks, which for most employees come Oct. 29.

Labor Secretary Thomas Perez greeted returning workers with a sympathetic email. “Unfortunately, as President Obama correctly noted, you are occasionally called on to perform your remarkably important work in a climate that too often treats federal employees and contractors as a punching bag,” Perez said.

The Defense Department called back about 7,000 furloughed civilians. In an open letter to the workforce, Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel said the

department still faces budget uncertainty as Congress struggles to pass a 2014 spending bill and deal with automatic budget cuts. Pentagon Comptroller Robert Hale said the department lost at least \$600 million worth of productivity during the four days that civilians were furloughed.

The National Institutes of Health warned university scientists not to expect a quick resumption of research dollars.

At the National Institute of Standards and Technology in Gaithersburg, Md., email servers were slowly grinding back into gear.

Fire protection engineer Dan Madrzykowski had been in the office for about half an hour and about 800 emails had popped into his inbox. And that represented less than a week of the shutdown. Still, Madrzykowski said he was pleased to be back.

“Nothing good was coming from keeping the government closed,” he said.

Patrice Roberts, who works for Homeland Security, said she wasn’t prepared for the emotional lows of the past 16 days.

“It’s just frustrating having that kind of control over your life and just having it taken away from me,” said Roberts, who is expecting another shutdown in January. “I’ll be better prepared next time.”

In Pottsville, Pa., several people waited outside the Social Security office ahead of its 9 a.m. opening. James Ulrich, an unemployed 19-year-old, needed a replacement for his lost Social Security card to apply for jobs. He was told a replacement card would take two weeks to arrive.

“I don’t have a really good outlook on the government,” he said.

In Cincinnati, Renee Yankey, a government alcohol and tobacco tax specialist, was sleep-deprived after staying up late to watch news of the shutdown-ending deal, but otherwise glad to be back at work with the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau.

“I can tell that the alcohol industry missed us,” Yankey said. “The first thing I hear is ‘I’m so glad I got a person on the phone!’”

DNA links mysterious Yeti to ancient polar bear

LONDON (AP) — A British scientist says he may have solved the mystery of the Abominable Snowman — the elusive ape-like creature of the Himalayas. He thinks it’s a bear.

DNA analysis conducted by Oxford University genetics professor Bryan Sykes suggests the creature, also known as the Yeti, is the descendant of an ancient polar bear.

Sykes compared DNA from hair samples taken from two Himalayan animals — identified by local people as Yetis — to a database of animal genomes. He found they shared a genetic fingerprint with a polar bear jawbone found in the Norwegian Arctic that is at least 40,000 years old.

Sykes said Thursday that the tests showed the creatures were not related to modern Himalayan bears but were direct descendants of the prehistoric animal.

He said, “it may be a new species, it may be a hybrid” between polar bears and brown bears.

“The next thing is go there and find one.”

Sykes put out a call last year for museums, scientists and Yeti aficionados to share hair samples thought to be from the creature.

One of the samples he analyzed came from an alleged Yeti mummy in the Indian region of Ladakh, at the Western edge of the Himalayas, and was taken by a French mountaineer who was shown the corpse 40 years ago.

The other was a single hair found a decade ago in Bhutan, 800 miles (1,300 kilometers) to the east.

Sykes said the fact the hair samples were found so far apart, and so recently, suggests the members of the species are still alive.

“I can’t imagine we managed to get samples from the only two ‘snow bears’ in the Himalayas,” he said.

Finding a living creature could explain whether differences in appearance and behavior to other bears account for descriptions of the Yeti as a hairy hominid.

“The polar bear ingredient in their genomes may have changed their behavior so they act differ-

ent, look different, maybe walk on two feet more often,” he said.

Sykes’ research has not been published, but he says he has submitted it for peer review. His findings will be broadcast Sunday in a television program on Britain’s Channel 4.

Tom Gilbert, professor of paleogenomics at the Natural History Museum of Denmark, said Sykes’ research provided a “reasonable explanation” for Yeti sightings.

“It’s a lot easier to believe that than if he had found something else,” said Gilbert, who was not involved in the study. “If he had said it’s some kind of new primate, I’d want to see all the data.”

Sykes’ findings are unlikely to lay the myth of the Yeti to rest.

The Yeti or Abominable Snowman is one of a number of legendary ape-like beasts — along with Sasquatch and Bigfoot — reputed to live in heavily forested or snowy mountains. Scientists are skeptical, but decades of eyewitness reports, blurry photos and stories have kept the legend alive.

Minnesota Iron Range's environment considered at Iron County Citizens Forum program

MERCER, Wis. — Nancy Schultdt, a water resources specialist at the Fond du Lac Band's Environmental Quality Program in Cloquet, Minn., shared information about the environmental impacts of taconite mining in Minnesota at a recent meeting of the Iron County Citizens Forum.

The Minnesota Mesabi Iron Range has had active iron mining since the late 1800s, and has had taconite open pit mining since the 1950s.

Schultdt summarized the environmental "footprint" of Minnesota's mining operations, including landscape leveling, loss of high quality wetlands, elimination of headwater streams as they are buried or excavated, movement of water from one watershed to another, loss of

wildlife corridors for species such as moose or deer, air quality and visibility concerns, mercury loading in waterways and lakes, drawdowns in local wells, increased flooding in streams, and loss of traditional cultural sites.

"Minnesota's taconite plants are the largest source of mercury to the Lake Superior basin, adding 800 pounds per year," said Schultdt. "A recent study found that 10 percent of newborn babies in the Lake Superior basin have mercury levels over EPA standards."

In addition, Schultdt described the "fingerprint" of Minnesota's mines — the effects on water quality.

She spoke about impacts of sulfate on water resources. Sulfates are created when rock formations are blasted or crushed

and sulfur in the rocks comes in contact with air and/or water.

She said the disposal basins seep waters into downstream creeks and the effluent contains elevated levels of sulfate which can impair wild rice beds, increase methyl mercury in waters and fish and cause eutrophication of lakes and rivers.

Minnesota does have a sulfate standard for taconite facilities requiring downstream protection of wild rice waters, according to Schultdt, but it was only applied to a permit one time by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency and it was sued by the industry facility and halted environmental enforcement action.

"Recently, the Environmental Protection Agency has begun working with Minnesota regula-

tors to encourage enforcement, but even today, no facility on the Iron Range meets the wild rice sulfate standard," Schultdt said.

When asked about asbestos, Schultdt said the Peter Mitchell Pit in the eastern part of the Range has significant issues with asbestos-like mineral fibers, but most of the Minnesota taconite facilities do not have asbestos fibers. Many of the asbestos-bearing rocks are found in Wisconsin and Michigan.

During the question and answer session, reclamation of mines sites was brought up. She said in Minnesota, taconite mines are forbidden from reclaiming waste rock piles as they are seen as future resources that could be mined when technologies improve. She said there are a few recreational lakes in

the Boundary Waters Canoe Area. "Because the deposit is huge and the ore grade low, large amounts of waste rock and tailings would leach higher levels of toxic metals than existing taconite mines," Schultdt said.

Reciting Pledge of Allegiance should lead to citizenship reflection, discussion

Michigan's K-12 public schools are now required to set aside a portion of each school day for students to recite the Pledge of Allegiance. It's a state law, but is it needed?

On one hand, it shouldn't take a mandate to get it done. The pledge should be part of the school day at least through middle school when, hopefully, students have learned to say it by heart. It takes less than 30 seconds to recite the whole thing, and it's an important component to civics education.

The pledge gives students a chance to reflect on their U.S. citizenship. Hopefully, that leads to some discussion about what it means to be an American and what values the country holds dear.

One of those values is honoring diversity and differences of opinion. The new law does give students an out — they aren't compelled to say the pledge if they object. And it specifically says students can't be the target of bullying if that's their choice.

In the real world, however, the problem isn't so easily addressed. Some teachers worry students will, in fact, become targets for criticism if they don't pipe up during the pledge. It's an unneeded stress at a time when schools are heavily focused on drumming bully behavior out of their districts.

If there is any good in the new mandate, it's in the fact that it can open the doors to more discussion on the principles of American democracy.

One of those principles is that we can respect those who don't share our opinions, including those who support or challenge the pledge itself.

Saginaw Township Community Schools Superintendent Doug Trombley has an interesting take.

He says, "One of the things we try to do is give students a global perspective, when people exhibit choice and choose not to recite it, that might invoke discussion and understanding of different viewpoints."

Amen, that's when education takes place.

But did the Michigan Legislature need to get involved? On one hand, their action does further the discussion when it comes to the pledge and meeting requirements of state law. On the other hand, isn't that really the job of our civics teachers and children's parents?

Women are taking over

The headline in the Washington Post read, "Moderates flex muscle." Below that were pictures of 12 senators, six from each party, who are helping to forge a bipartisan compromise that would reopen the government and pay its bills. But the story never mentioned a key fact: Five of the 12 are women, three Republicans and two Democrats.

That's no accident. The 20 female members of the Senate might be the last outpost of civility and sanity left on Capitol Hill.

Sen. Susan Collins, the Maine Republican who organized the group, told the New York Times: "I don't think it's a coincidence that women were so heavily involved in trying to end this stalemate. Although we span the ideological spectrum, we are used to working together in a collaborative way."

That's true, and Sen. Maria Cantwell, a Washington Democrat, made a good point on MSNBC: "If it were up to the women, this would be over already. There's still a lot of testosterone going around."

Even as the current stalemate reaches a conclusion, a new round of budget talks will start immediately. And it's critical that female legislators from both parties stay involved and dilute the male hormones Cantwell describes. As Sen. Amy Klobuchar, a Minnesota Democrat, noted on MSNBC's "Morning Joe," the women provide "a good model going forward" that restores and reinforces one of the most important words in the political lexicon: Compromise.

Of course, not all women are pragmatists. Sen. Deb Fischer, a Nebraska Republican, is a hardline conservative and Sen. Elizabeth Warren, a Massachusetts Democrat, is a doctrinaire liberal. And then there's the former mayor of Wasilla, Alaska, who once ran for vice president and now seems increasingly detached from reality.

But in a capital choking on toxic levels of partisan hostility, the women senators have made a deliberate and determined effort to maintain communication across party lines. They meet about every six weeks for private dinners, and last Monday, in the midst of the current kerfuffle, the two New Hampshire senators — Democrat Jeanne Shaheen and Republican Kelly Ayotte — co-hosted an emergency girls-only pizza party.

"We're meeting, getting to know each other on a personal level," Ayotte told MSNBC. "Certainly on Monday night, there was frustration on both sides of the aisle: 'Let's get this resolved for the American people.'"

Some of the women reflect the politics of their home regions, swing states like New Hampshire that oscillate in their voting habits. Republican senators like Collins of Maine and Lisa Murkowski of Alaska come from states that also elected senators from other parties; so did Democrat senators Claire McCaskill of Missouri and Heidi Heitkamp of North Dakota.

But let's be honest. There are inherent gender differences. Women are better at working and playing with others. As Sen. Debbie Stabenow, a Michigan Democrat, puts it, when women cooperate, "it's much less about ego and more about problem-solving."

Women also share life experiences that help shape their approach to politics. "We're all used to balancing family budgets and dealing with children that are bullies and misbehave," Stabenow told MSNBC. "And so sometimes that comes in handy."

For most of our history women were virtually invisible on Capitol Hill. It's stunning to realize that of the 44 women who have ever served in the Senate, almost half are there today. The first 13 female senators were appointed to replace their husbands, and the first woman to be elected on her own was Nancy Landon Kassebaum, who didn't arrive until in 1978.

Since women comprise 53 percent of the electorate, 20 percent of the Senate is still a dismally low figure. Still, it represents real progress, a critical mass in terms of numbers and experience. Many are proven political players — Shaheen was New Hampshire's governor, for example, while Ayotte was the state's attorney general. So when the guys try to push them around, they know how to push back.

Then there's the seniority system, which frustrated many women when they first came to Congress and is now their best friend. Seven women chair Senate committees, including some of the most important: Barbara Mikulski of Maryland on Appropriations, Patty Murray of Washington on Budget, and Dianne Feinstein of California on Intelligence.

"The women are taking over," cracked Sen. John McCain of Arizona, and while he didn't seem all that thrilled at the prospect, the country would be better off if he were right. If the grownups manage to recapture Capitol Hill, if the forces of reasonableness are restored to power, many of them will be wearing skirts.

On Oct. 18, 1962, James D. Watson, Francis Crick and Maurice Wilkins were honored with the Nobel Prize for Medicine and Physiology for determining the double-helix molecular structure of DNA.

On this Date
In 1685, King Louis XIV signed the Edict of Fontainebleau, revoking the Edict of Nantes that had established legal toleration of France's Protestant population, the Huguenots.

In 1812, during the War of 1812, the British ship HMS Frolic was captured off the Virginia coast by the crew of the USS Wasp, which was in turn captured by the HMS Poitiers.

In 1867, the United States took formal possession of Alaska from Russia.

In 1892, the first long-distance telephone line between New York and Chicago was officially opened (it could only handle one call at a time).

In 1912, black boxer Jack Johnson was arrested in Chicago, accused of violating the Mann Act because of his relationship with his white girlfriend, Lucille Cameron. (The case collapsed when Cameron refused to cooperate, but Johnson was later re-arrested and convicted on the testimony of a former mistress, Belle Schreiber.)

In 1922, the British Broadcasting Co., Ltd. (later the British Broadcasting Corp.) was founded.

In 1931, inventor Thomas Alva Edison died in West Orange, N.J., at age 84.



In 1961, the movie musical "West Side Story," starring Natalie Wood and Richard Beymer, premiered in New York, the film's setting.

In 1969, the federal government banned artificial sweeteners known as cyclamates because of evidence they caused cancer in laboratory rats.

In 1971, the Knapp Commission began public hearings into allegations of corruption in the New York City police department (the witnesses included Frank Serpico).

In 1972, Congress passed the Clean Water Act, overriding President

Richard M. Nixon's veto. In 1977, West German commandos stormed a hijacked Lufthansa jetliner on the ground in Mogadishu, Somalia, freeing all 86 hostages and killing three of the four hijackers.

Obama joked that he did better in the second presidential debate because he got a good long nap in the first one, while Romney quipped that the white-tie gala gave him and his wife Ann the chance to dress as they do around the house. The Detroit Tigers completed a four-game sweep of the New York Yankees, winning the finale of the American League Championship Series 8-1.

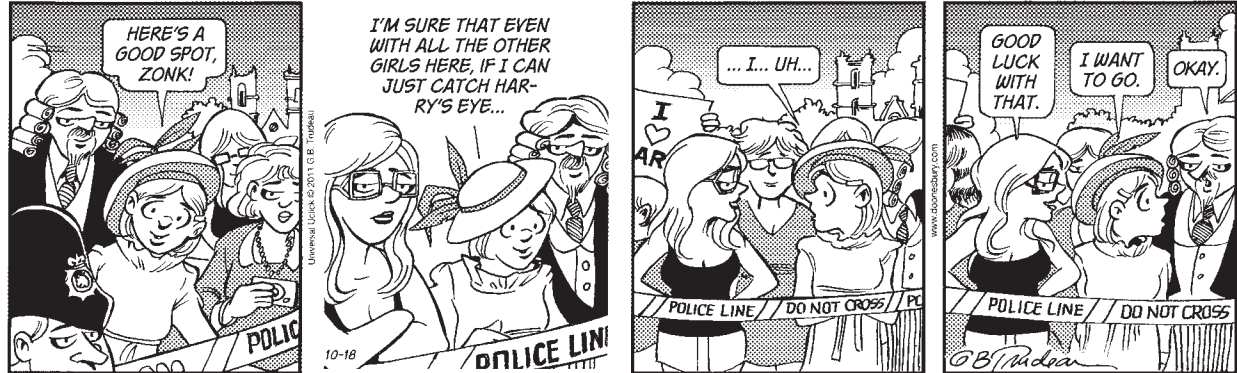

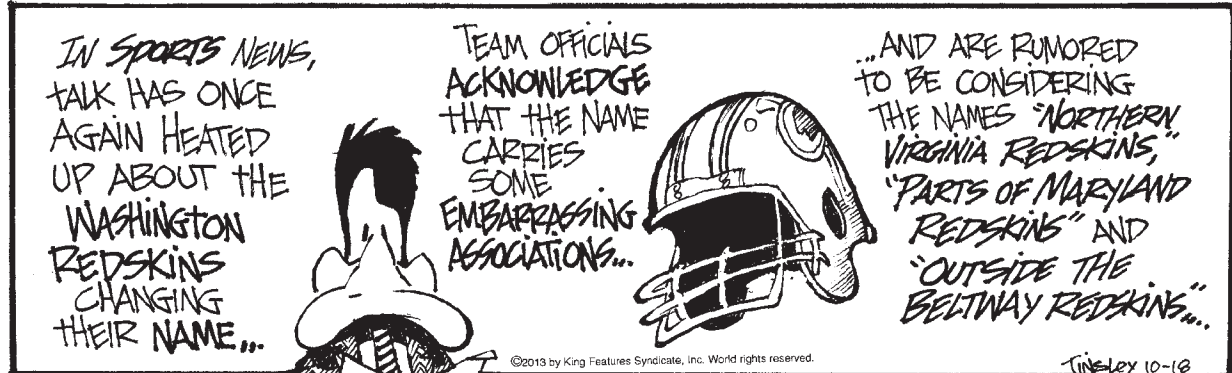

approved. The commission rejected that effort because it found not all of the statements were factual.

McDonald again denied any wrongdoing on Thursday. "I have done nothing wrong. The petition to recall is motivated by Ms. Graham's desire to silence a vocal critic of school board policy," he said.

McDonald admitted he campaigned against the failed bond referendum, but said it was his right to do so as a citizen.

He said he didn't tell anyone there was a plan B on the ballot, but used the term as figure of speech.

He also said foul language isn't a sufficient cause for a recall and should lead to a reprimand from the school board instead.

McDonald denied meddling in the contract for a roof job on the high school.

Graham said she had removed the items that were considered opinion from her first recall ballot effort.

She said McDonald gave a contractor a "heads up" by providing him with contract specifications that hadn't been board-approved and described how he slams his hand on the table at board meeting when he gets frustrated, and then swears.

Members of the election panel are county clerk Gerry Pelissero, county treasurer Sue Pertile and probate judge Joel Massie.

Of the new language, Pelissero said, "It's clear and the facts are there for people to make an informed decision."

Pertile and Massie agreed, also approving the language with a show of hands.

Massie explained to McDonald that he can appeal the election commission's decision to the circuit court, if he so chooses.

NYPD: Teens in shop with apparent remains arrested

NEW YORK (AP) — New York City police say two teenage girls who were stopped as they were leaving a Manhattan store because they were believed to be shoplifting and were found to be carrying what appeared to be a fetus have been arrested.

Authorities say 17-year-old girls were arrested Thursday on charges of petit larceny. One has been hospitalized and the other is being questioned by police. The medical examiner's office is performing an autopsy on the apparent human remains found inside the bag. More serious charges could follow.

The girls were shopping at a Victoria's Secret lingerie store in midtown Manhattan on Thursday. Police say one of the girls told police she gave birth a day earlier but didn't know what to do with the remains. Officials say they don't think the girl gave birth at the store.

Victoria's Secret is owned by Columbus, Ohio-based Limited Brands. A spokeswoman for the company referred calls to the NYPD.

Obama taps Homeland Security secretary

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Barack Obama is calling back a trusted counterterrorism adviser from his first term by nominating former top Pentagon lawyer Jeh Johnson as secretary of homeland security.

Obama plans to announce Johnson's nomination Friday. He must be confirmed by the Senate before taking over the post most recently held by Janet Napolitano, who stepped down in August to become president of the University of California system.

As general counsel at the Defense Department during the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, Johnson was an aggressive advocate on a number of complex and contentious legal issues. He oversaw the escalation of the use of

unmanned drone strikes, the revamping of military commissions to try terrorism suspects rather than using civilian courts and the repeal of the military's ban on openly gay service members. He also mapped out the legal defense for the American cross-border raid into Pakistan that killed Osama bin Laden.

A senior Obama administration official on Thursday confirmed Johnson's selection, first reported by The Daily Beast. The official was not authorized to speak about the nomination on the record and spoke on condition of anonymity.

The official said Obama chose Johnson because of his experience as a national security leader. The official noted that Johnson oversaw the work of more than 10,000 lawyers and was responsible for reviewing every military operation approved by the president and defense secretary.

1.8M-year-old skull gives glimpse of our evolution

DMANISI, Georgia (AP) — The discovery of a 1.8-million-year-old skull of a human ancestor buried under a medieval Georgian village provides a vivid picture of early evolution and indicates our family tree may have fewer branches than some believe, scientists say.

The fossil is the most complete pre-human skull uncovered. With other partial remains previously found at the rural site, it gives researchers the earliest evidence of human ancestors moving out of Africa and spreading north to the rest of the world, according to a study published Thursday in the journal Science.

The skull and other remains offer a glimpse of a population of pre-humans of various sizes living at the same time — something that scientists had not seen before for such an ancient era. This diversity bolsters one of two competing theories about the way our early ancestors evolved, spreading out more like a tree than a bush.

Obama lashes Republicans as government reopens

WASHINGTON (AP) — In withering day-after criticism, President Barack Obama declared Thursday that the 16-day partial government shutdown was a Republican-provoked spectacle that "encouraged our enemies" around the world.

Elsewhere in Washington, and around the country, federal employees simply streamed back to their jobs. National parks reopened. The popular panda cam at the National Zoo came back online.

But there was no letup in the political fight.

Fresh from a defeat, tea party groups and their allies renewed fundraising efforts with a promise of future assaults on Obama's health care overhaul — and a threat of more election primaries against Republican incumbents who don't stand with them.

Government spending was still front and center. Inside the Capitol, lawmakers charged with forging a post-shutdown deficit-cutting agreement in the next 60 days met privately. "We believe there is common ground," said Sen. Patty Murray, D-Wash., chair of the Senate Budget Committee.

Privately, however, officials in both parties said the prospects for a major breakthrough were dim, given differences over taxes and spending that have proven compromise-proof throughout the current three-year era of divided government.

A few hours after Obama placed his post-midnight signature on legislation ending the long political showdown, Vice President Joe Biden was at the Environmental Protection Agency to greet returning employees. "I hope this is the end of this," he said, but he acknowledged "There's no guarantees."

That was a reference to the last-minute legislation that will fund the government only until Jan 15 and give Treasury the ability to borrow above the \$16.7 trillion limit until Feb. 7 or a few weeks longer.

At the White House, Obama blended sharp criticism of Republicans with a plea for their cooperation over the remainder of the year and a call for less shrillness on both sides.

"Some of the same folks who pushed for the shutdown and threatened default claimed their

actions were needed to get America back on track," he said in remarks in the State Dining Room.

"But probably nothing has done more damage to America's credibility to the world. ... It's encouraged our enemies. It's emboldened our competitors. And it's depressed our friends who look to us for steady leadership," he said.

Obama said the public is "completely fed up with Washington" and he and Congress face hard work in regaining trust. It was a reference to public opinion polls that show the nation in a sour mood — though more inclined to blame Republicans than the president and his party for the first partial government shutdown caused by politics in 17 years.

Hoping to jump-start his own stalled agenda, Obama urged lawmakers to concentrate on three items in the coming weeks: a balanced plan to reduce long-term deficits, legislation to overhaul the immigration system and passage of a farm bill.

Polling aside, Obama's party emerged from the three-week showdown in Congress united. All Democrats in Congress supported the legislation that passed Wednesday night to fund the government and raise the debt limit.

Not so of the Republicans. Eighteen GOP members in the Senate and 144 in the House opposed the legislation, while 27 in the Senate and 87 in the House supported it.

The fault line separated tea party adherents from the balance of the rank and file. And there were clear signs the split was enduring, though not widening.

Harteloo not employed by company

IRONWOOD — A spokesperson for Jake's Excavating said Thursday that John Harteloo is not working for the company in razing his former residence at 213 Bonnie St.

As the Daily Globe previously reported, an Ironwood resident complained to the Ironwood Public Safety Department that Harteloo was at the site of the condemned structure.

Harteloo told the IPSD he was working for Jake's Excavating and he had permission to be on the property.

A company employee said Thursday Harteloo was permitted on the property to retrieve some of his belongings, but he is not employed by the company and won't be allowed to remain on the site in the future.

New runway to start easing delays at O'Hare

CHICAGO (AP) — One after another, planes roared down a new runway Thursday at O'Hare International Airport, where years of crippling delays stalled the nation's entire aviation system and earned the busy hub a reputation as a kind of traveler's curse.

Chicago aviation officials promised the new 10,800-foot airstrip would reduce delays at O'Hare — one of the nation's most important crossroads — by up to 50 percent while allowing for nearly 90,000 additional flights per year. It is part of an \$8 billion overhaul that began in 2003 and is reconfiguring O'Hare's outdated layout of crisscrossing runways into a modern and more efficient parallel system.

"It will improve the efficiency of the national aviation system from coast to coast," Chicago Aviation Commissioner Rosemarie Andolino said of the new runway at a ceremony to mark its opening.

3 Wisconsin lawmakers to serve on budget committee

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Republican Rep. Reid Ribble was the only member of Wisconsin's congressional delegation not to vote along party lines on a deal to reopen the government.

All three Democratic House members and Democratic Sen. Tammy Baldwin voted yes on Wednesday's deal, which extends the debt limit and avoids a threatened national default. Republican Sen. Ron Johnson voted no, as did Rep. Paul Ryan and three other GOP congressmen.

But Ribble sided with Democrats. He said there were parts of the bill he opposed, but he was willing to give Congress a chance to work on a proper budget without a looming threat of default.

"I have chosen to give the Congress a 90-day opportunity to actually work within a

framework to budget and appropriate funds in regular order and end the nonsense of continuing resolutions," he said in a statement.

Among other things, the legislation would fund the government through Jan. 15, and award back pay to more than 2 million federal workers, whether they had been furloughed or remained on the job.

Rep. Ron Kind, a Democrat from La Crosse, said the deal allows the government to get back to serving the American people, and it ensures the country can pay its bills.

"Congress has to stop acting as a road block to economic growth and more as a partner to the private sector," he said.

But Johnson criticized the legislation as fiscally irresponsible. He said Democratic

leaders have shown they're more than willing to pass the country's debt burden to future generations rather than enact real financial reforms.

The congressional deal includes a provision that turns over negotiations on a long-term budget agreement to a committee Ryan is expected to co-chair, the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel reported. Ryan, who voted against the proposal, said the legislation represented a "missed opportunity" to help draw down the national debt.

"I hope both sides will work together in the months ahead to pay down the debt, provide relief for families, and grow the economy," he said.

Baldwin and Johnson were appointed Thursday to serve on the committee as well.

Michigan's national parks back in business

EMPIRE (AP) — Michigan's four national parks are back in business following Congress' approval of a budget deal that reopened the federal government.

Officials with Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore, Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore, Isle Royale National Park and Keweenaw National Historical Park said Thursday they're up and running.

Although all national parks were officially off-limits during the 16-day partial shutdown, the closure was widely ignored at Sleeping Bear Dunes, where people made frequent use of hiking trails.

But officials said barriers that had limited access in some places were being removed.

Also reopening are Michigan's national forests. Ken Arbogast of Huron-Manistee National Forest said its campgrounds are closed for the season but offices will reopen today to handle matters such as issuing permits to cut firewood.

US Silica could open Eau Claire County mine

EAU CLAIRE, Wis. (AP) — U.S. Silica is considering opening a frack sand mining operation that would be Eau Claire County's largest.

A company representative said the site under consideration is 650 acres in the town of Fairchild. The operation would be larger than U.S. Silica's other Wisconsin mine, which is in Sparta.

The company says the Eau Claire operation would likely employ more than 60 people and would use a rail line near the site to transport minerals. A public meeting is scheduled Monday evening at the elementary school in Fairchild.

Currently, Eau Claire County has three frack sand operations — Hi Crush, High Country Sand and Five Star Properties.

Detroit auto shop sheep heading for farm life

DETROIT (AP) — A sheep that made a surprise visit to a Detroit auto collision shop is getting a new home at a Michigan animal sanctuary.

The animal showed up at Nortown Collision & Glass Co. on the city's east side on Tues-

day, darting through an open door and running around for about 20 minutes before workers corralled the animal. The sheep, which may have been destined for slaughter, was OK.

The Detroit Free Press and The Detroit News report it was taken Wednesday to a Michigan Humane Society facility. Group spokesman Ryan McTigue says the sheep will be "living the good life" at the Sanctuary And Safe Haven for Animals Farm in Manchester.

Detroit Police Sgt. Michael Woody says: "He got away. He deserves his life."

China-based group buys ex-Detroit Free Press home

DETROIT (AP) — A development group from China has scooped up two downtown Detroit buildings, including the former home of the Detroit Free Press.

The newspaper and The Detroit News report Shanghai-based DDI Group paid \$4.2 million for the Albert Kahn-designed former Free Press building and \$9.4 million for the 38-story David Stott building. The purchases were finalized this week after an online auction.

Plans call for the former newspaper headquarters to be converted for residential use, with 150 units and retail on the ground floor. Renovations could cost \$40 million to \$50 million. Work also is planned at the David Stott building, which will be marketed as office space.

The former Free Press building has two six-story wings flanking a 13-story central tower. The newspaper now is based nearby.

More bison die at Chippewa Falls zoo

CHIPPEWA FALLS, Wis. (AP) — A virus at a local zoo in western Wisconsin continues to decimate the bison herd.

The Irvine Park Zoo has lost two additional bison, bringing the total to four deaths since last month. The zoo has five remaining bison.

Veterinarians say the bison contracted a virus from sheep that shared a fence line with the animals.

Chippewa Falls parks director, Dick Hebert, is asking the public to avoid the bison exhibit for now.

Fords' daughter promotes breast cancer awareness

Editor's Note: This is an AP Member Exchange shared by The Grand Rapids Press.

GRAND RAPIDS (AP) — As the daughter of Betty Ford, the woman credited with changing American attitudes toward breast cancer, Susan Ford Bales had to wonder: What was her risk for the disease?

About a year ago, after her mother's death, Bales decided to see if she had inherited one of the BRCA gene mutations that carry a sharply increased risk of breast cancer.

"I had the genetic test done," she said. "I don't carry the gene."

Bales, the daughter of former President Gerald R. Ford and first lady Betty Ford, discussed her genetic risks in an interview Monday with The Grand Rapids Press after taking part in a breast cancer seminar sponsored by Spectrum Health at DeVos Place in Grand Rapids.

When she learned her test result, Bales said, "I was ecstatic."

Her concern was not just for herself but for also her two daughters and her granddaughter. If she carried the gene mutation, she could have passed it on to them. To know she was not a carrier was a big relief.

"It doesn't mean I'm not going to get breast cancer," she added. "I could still get breast cancer. It takes my numbers down some."

Betty Ford, who died July 8, 2011, was never tested for a breast cancer gene mutation, Bales said.

She added she particularly was concerned about her genetic risks because breast cancer is

on both sides of her family history. Her dad's mother, Dorothy Ayer Gardner Ford, also had the disease.

The average American woman has a 12.5 percent lifetime risk of developing breast cancer, said Dr. Judy Hiemenga, a geneticist with Spectrum Health.

The majority of cases are diagnosed in women who have no family history of the disease.

But those who carry the BRCA 1 and 2 genes face risks of 50 percent to 85 percent. Many of those who carry the abnormal genes eventually opt for a double mastectomy to prevent cancer, Hiemenga said.

Bales advised those worried about their risks to talk to a genetics counselor about whether to be tested.

Speaking at the seminar, she recalled how her parents discussed whether her mother should talk publicly about her breast cancer — or even mention the word "breast" in public — when she was diagnosed in 1974. Betty Ford said it was time to end the silence about the disease.

"In an instant, Betty Ford changed the history of women's health," Bales said.

Her mother would have been proud to see the crowd that filled a DeVos Place ballroom

for the seminar on breast cancer and genetics, she said. Despite the progress made in early detection and treatment, there is still a need to raise awareness "until we have the magic silver bullet," she added.

"We haven't defeated this disease. I don't want my children to have to deal with this."

S&P 500 reaches all-time high after US debt deal

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market hit an all-time high Thursday as Wall Street put the government shutdown and debt ceiling crisis behind it and focused on corporate earnings.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index rose 11.61 points, or 0.7 percent, to close at 1,733.15 — a record close. Nine of the 10 industry groups in the index finished higher, with technology the only group that fell.

The market rose throughout the day as investors got back to focusing on corporate earnings and economic data. American Express and Verizon rose the most in the Dow Jones industrial average after reporting earnings that beat expectations from financial analysts.

The Dow ended the day down two points, or 0.01 percent, to 15,371.65. The index of 30 big U.S. companies was held back by declines in IBM, Goldman Sachs and UnitedHealth.

IBM's third-quarter revenue fell and missed Wall Street's forecast by more than \$1 billion. The stock closed down \$11.90, or 6 percent, to \$174.80. Earlier, it had touched its lowest level of the past year — \$172.57.

Goldman Sachs also weighed down the index. The

investment bank's revenue fell sharply as trading in bonds and other securities slowed. Goldman fell \$3.93, or 2.4 percent, to \$158.32.

The focus on earnings is a change of pace for Wall Street, which had been absorbed in Washington's political drama over the last month.

Now that the U.S. has avoided the possibility of default, at least for a few months, earnings news is expected to dominate trading for the next couple weeks. So far, only 79 companies in the S&P 500 have reported third-quarter results, according to S&P Capital IQ. Analysts expect earnings at those companies to increase 3.3 percent over the same period a year ago.

"I don't think we can completely close the door on the debt ceiling chapter just yet, but we can get back to the stuff that really matters," said Jonathan Corpina, who manages trading on the floor of the New York Stock Exchange for Meridian Equity Partners.

Other indexes also posted noticeable gains. The Nasdaq composite closed up 23.71 points, or 0.6 percent, to 3,863.15.

The Russell 2000 index, which is made up of primarily

smaller, riskier companies, also hit an all-time high. It closed up 9.85 points, or 0.9 percent, to 1,102.27 and has risen nearly 30 percent this year.

Market analysts think the 16-day partial shutdown of the government caused billions of dollars of damage to the economy. Government employees were furloughed, contracts were delayed, and tourism declined at national parks.

Analysts at Wells Fargo said the shutdown likely lowered economic growth by 0.5 percentage point.

There remain broader concerns that Democrats and Republicans won't be able to draw up a longer-term budget. The deal approved late Wednesday only permits the Treasury Department to borrow through Feb. 7 and fund the government through Jan. 15.

"The agreement represents another temporary fix that pushes fiscal uncertainty into the early months of next year," Wells Fargo analysts said.

Despite the worries, signs of normalcy returned to financial markets Thursday.

The one-month Treasury bill was back to trading at a yield of 0.01 percent, about where it was a month ago, and down sharply from 0.35 percent on Tuesday.

Usually a staid, conservative security, the one-month T-bill was subjected to a wave of selling at the beginning of the month. Investors feared the T-bill would be the first piece of government debt to be affected by a U.S. default if the debt ceiling was breached and the federal government could no longer pay its obligations.

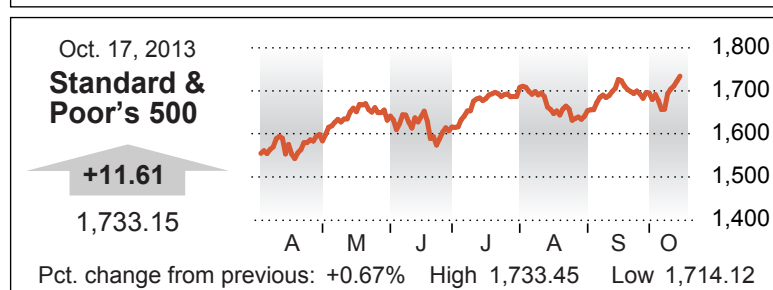
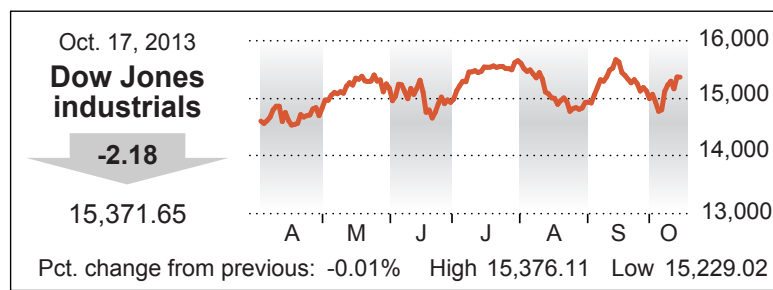
The yield on the more closely-watched 10-year Treasury note fell to 2.60 percent from 2.67 percent Wednesday.

Among other stock moves:

— Verizon rose \$1.65, or 4 percent, to \$48.90. The telecommunications company earned an adjusted 77 cents per share for the recent quarter, beating expectations of financial analysts.

— UnitedHealth Group dropped \$3.82, or 5 percent, to \$71.37. The health insurance giant narrowed its 2013 profit forecast, instead of raising it, giving some analysts pause.

Chipotle profit heats up as it draws more diners

NEW YORK (AP) — Chipotle says its profit rose 15 percent in the third quarter as more customers flocked to its restaurants for burritos, tacos and bowls.

The Denver-based company said sales at restaurants open at least a year, a key metric, rose 6.2 percent in the period, driven by higher customer traffic. The sales jump follows a 4.8 percent increase a year ago.

Chipotle, which has more than 1,500 locations, has surged in popularity because customers see it as being a step up from traditional fast-food chains such as Burger King and Wendy's. People also like that they can customize their orders, dictating which ingredients they want on their orders.

The company's healthy sales performance is in contrast to the performance of several major food companies including McDonald's in recent quarters, which have cited the challenging economy for underwhelming sales results.

But some companies seem from insulated from such outside factors. Starbucks, for instance reported a surprisingly strong 9 percent sales increase at locations open at least a year in its most recent quarter.

As for Chipotle, the chain's "Food With Integrity" ethos has also helped it cultivate a powerful marketing message. It

recently generated buzz online with a cartoon video depicting a dystopian world where big food companies fatten chickens with injections and keep cows stuffed in crates. By contrast, the video depicted Chipotle's food as being homemade from fresh ingredients.

The video got more than 7 million hits on YouTube.

For the quarter, Chipotle Mexican Grill Inc. earned \$83.4 million, or \$2.66 per share. That's up from \$72.3 million, or \$2.27 per share, a year ago. Analysts expected \$2.78 per share.

Revenue rose 18 percent to \$826.9 million, topping the \$820.3 million analysts expected.

For the year, the company said it expects sales at restaurants open at least a year to grow by a mid-single-digit percentage. For 2014, it forecast low-single-digit growth, excluding any menu price increases.

Its stock rose almost 2 percent in after-hours trading.

Red Sox take two of three in Detroit

DETROIT (AP) — Miguel Cabrera hobbled through a stop sign, gently colliding with the catcher for an easy out at home.

Anibal Sanchez showed none of his no-hit stuff, Detroit's first shaky outing from its rotation in the AL championship series.

And yet the Comerica Park crowd had a chance to roar Thursday night when Prince Fielder came to the plate in the fifth and seventh innings. But each time, Fielder failed to come through and cheers quickly turned to jeers for the slumping slugger.

Fielder extended his postseason drought without an RBI to a career-long 65 at-bats and that helped Boston hold on for a 4-3 win and a 3-2 series lead that put the Tigers on the brink of elimination.

"He's had some good at-bats, doesn't have a lot to show for it, and some not so good at-bats," Tigers manager Jim Leyland said. "I still feel good something big could happen at any time."

The rotund first baseman doesn't deserve all the blame, but he's

going to get a lot of it — especially if Detroit doesn't win the last two games in the best-of-seven series.

Tigers owner Mike Ilitch gave his OK to sign Fielder to a \$214 million, nine-year deal last year to replace the then-injured Victor Martinez, expecting him to produce at the plate.

Fielder simply has not, often swinging early in counts for weak grounders that make fans in the Motor City groan.

He hasn't driven in a run during the postseason in 17-plus games since the opener of the 2012 ALCS against the New York Yankees. The longest RBI drought of his career during the regular season was with the Milwaukee Brewers during a 44 at-bat skid in 2008, according to STATS.

That from a five-time All-Star who's averaged 111 RBIs in his last seven seasons.

Fielder, though, wasn't Detroit's only problem in its third one-loss loss of the series, a defeat that put Boston within one win of the World Series.

Cabrera, who can barely run, in part because of a lingering groin injury, wrecked the Tigers' first chance to score in Game 5.

He may have seen third base coach Tom Brookens wave him home initially as he was running toward third when Jhonny Peralta singled with two outs in the first. But Cabrera didn't see, or he simply ignored, Brookens when he sent both arms up in the air to signal for him to stop and load the bases.

Add newspaper black and white to Halloween decor

What's black and white and orange all over? Creative Halloween decorations made out of newspaper.

Black and white newsprint is a perfect starting point for spooky crafts.

A lightweight foam wreath form covered with newspaper roses looks elegant on its own, but can be dressed up with mini faux pumpkins, glittery berries, a swarm of spiders or bats, or any other embellishments. Making the flowers is inexpensive and fairly uncomplicated, but it's not a quick process, particularly if you're covering a large wreath. So find a good scary movie on TV and settle in for a lot of cutting, rolling and gluing.

Pairing newspaper with black and orange cardstock to make a decorative garland, on the other hand, is both easy and fast. Just use a paper punch to cut the paper into circles, and run them through the sewing machine to chain them together.

Wreath

Materials:

- Foam wreath form
- Newspaper
- Hot glue gun and glue sticks
- Scissors
- Mini pumpkins or other embellishments

Instructions:

1. Cut several sheets of newspaper into 1 1/2 inch strips. Wrap them around the wreath form, overlapping each strip slightly, until it is covered. This will make it less obvious if there are any gaps between the paper flowers that will be glued on later.

2. Stack three sheets of newspaper and trace a small salad plate or similarly-sized round object on the top layer as many times as it will fit. Cut circles out of all three layers.

3. Hold three paper circles together in a stack and starting at the outside edge, cut through all layers in a spiral shape, moving from the outside toward the center. Try to keep the width of the resulting spiral-shaped strip consistent — mine were about 3/4 of an inch — but it doesn't have to be perfect. Real flower petals aren't!

4. When you get close to the center, make the end of the spiral a quarter-sized circle. This will become the base of the flower.

5. Starting from the outer edge of the spiral, start rolling the paper strip around itself. Roll the center fairly tightly, and then the rest looser to form the outer petals.

6. When you get close to the end, flip the flower

upside down on your work surface (it will resemble a tiny lampshade at this point) and apply glue to base of the flower. Press it against the rolled up paper to securely adhere the coiled paper to the base.

7. Repeat steps 2-6 to make enough flowers to cover your wreath.

8. Use hot glue to attach flowers to the wreath, placing them close together and avoiding gaps.

9. Embellish as desired.

Garland

Materials:

- Newspaper
- Black card stock
- Orange card stock
- 1/2-inch paper punch
- Sewing machine
- Thread

Instructions:

1. Use paper punch to cut circles from newspaper and cardstock.

2. Sew across one paper circle, and then continue running the machine to create a chain of thread extending from the circle. You can place the next circle right up against the previous, or leave a bit of thread in between.

3. Continue sewing paper circles in a chain, alternating with newspaper and card stock until garland reaches the desired length.

Familiar visitors: Fruit flies move indoors

I suppose I should look upon fruit flies as old friends. Our formal introduction took place in junior high school, in science lab. Now they visit regularly, every late summer and early fall.

Still, for old friends, they can be bothersome. No, they don't bite, but I'd rather do without their flitting around any ripening fruit in the kitchen.

Egg-laying right on schedule

As it turns out, fruit flies don't really turn up this time of year; they just make their presence known. All summer they've been hanging around outdoors, attracted there, as they are indoors, to ripe and overripe fruits. Cooling temperatures drive them indoors. An abundance of ripe and overripe apples, tomatoes, pears and other fruit, much of it now brought indoors, provides further enticement for their move.

It's actually fruit flies' larvae — small, white maggots — that are feeding on the fruits. After feasting for five or six days, larvae are transformed into the all-too-familiar flies. The females do more than just flit around for the few days they are alive; they fly up to six miles and keep busy laying eggs — up to 2,000 of them. The eggs hatch into maggots, which feed, become adults, and round the cycle goes, leading to skyrocketing populations of maggots and fruit flies.

Swat them

To control fruit flies, start by regularly discarding overripe fruit. It also helps to clean kitchen sink drains, where bits of fruits or their juices may lodge.

You could, of course, bypass the whole problem by not having any ripe fruit indoors except in the refrigerator. We gardeners know, however, how cold deadens the flavors of garden-fresh fruits, and even ruins the flavors of some, such

as tomatoes and bananas.

Fortunately, some simple devices can help in the war against fruit flies. There's some primal satisfaction in just swatting at them with a rolled-up, wet facecloth, or you could go a little more high-tech and vacuum them up right out of the air. Both of these methods must, of course, be kept up on a regular basis.

Trap them

Traps take less participation. For the simplest trap, just set out a glass of wine to which some dish detergent has been added — and be sure to label the glass so no one drinks the liquid. After landing on this liquid for a drink, fruit flies become wetted and are unable to take off again. Another trap capitalizes on fruit flies' low intelligence: A funnel set spout down over the opening of an upright glass filled with bait provides easy entry but clever exit, too clever for fruit flies.

A number of commercial traps, such as the Contech "Fruit Fly Trap," work on these same principles and are also effective.

Newly emerged fruit flies are attracted to light, a habit that can lead to their undoing. Shade all the windows in your kitchen except one, and leave only a crack of light coming through the bottom of that window. Put a baited dish near that opening, wait a while, then rush the dish, with attendant flies, outdoors.

On the same theme, darken with paper or dark paint the upper third of a one-quart jar, then coat the inside of the jar with something sticky such as honey or vegetable oil. Invert the jar, raised off the counter with some small blocks of wood, over some bait. Flies will feed and then fly up toward the light, where they will be trapped.

The flies are attracted to yeasts that cause fermentation, so any piece of fruit, even yeast and water, are suitable bait.

It was stage-type training. I had done amateur theater shows.

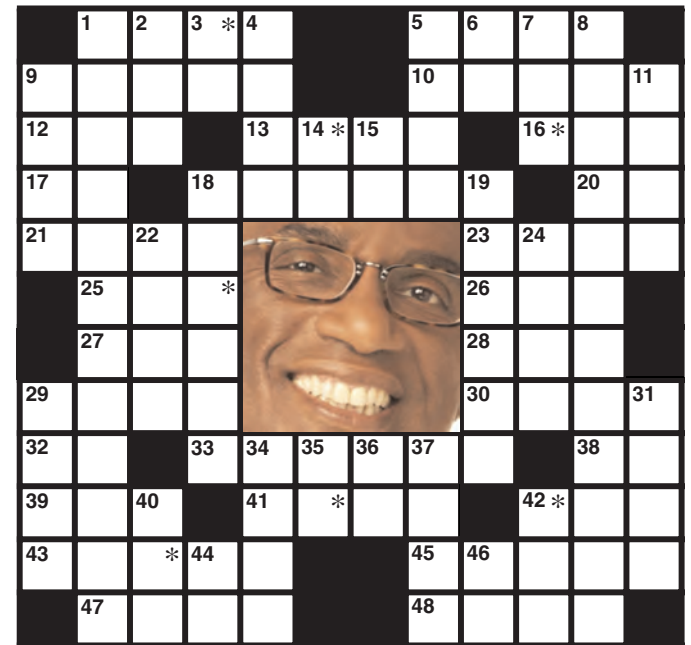
How do you describe your character, John Young?

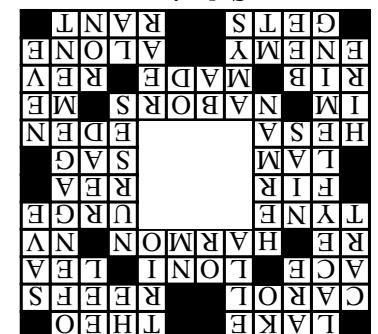

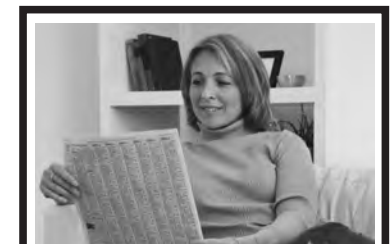

Terry Crews just has a good time. He laughs easily, frequently and loudly.

Whether he talks about his NFL days, his five kids or his latest role as Sgt. Terry Jeffords on Fox's Tuesday comedy "Brooklyn Nine-Nine," Crews is laid back and ready for fun.

At 45, Crews says he's happily surprised with life.

"I thought I would be a special effects artist after I retired from the NFL," he says at a Fox party. "I moved out here, and I ran out of money, and a friend invited me to go on an audition. And I got it. It was 'Battle Dome'. It was 'American Gladiators' to the 10th power – we were sending people to the hospital. And then I went on a movie audition. The first movie audition I ever got was 'The 6th Day.'"

Since that 2000 Arnold Schwarzenegger movie, Crews has worked steadily.

"I don't know what I was doing," he says. "I never took a class. I have always been a ham. I was the Jake Peralta of my locker room."

He refers to Andy Samberg's smart-aleck character on the show.

Crews' character is a tentative man. Since becoming a father to twins – Cagney and Lacey – he's afraid of pretty much everything. This presents a problem when you are a cop.

Crews says he's having a blast on the show.

"I love the setups," he says. "I love watching Andy fumble his way through."

Crews' lack of formal training is a help, and he compares acting to creating art.

"You get the same creative juices flowing," Crews says. "You learn how to make mistakes, and that's where I am right now."

"Actors always have some judge, someone that they are trying to impress," he says. "I try everything. I'll do a guest spot on 'Drunk History.'"
